

Minutes of the Special Meeting
of the Village of Sleepy Hollow,
January 4, 1971 - adjourned ses-
sion

The following are the minutes of the adjourned session of the special meeting held December 21, 1970. The meeting was called to order by Mr. McGowan, at his residence, at 7:50 p.m.. Roll call was taken and answered as follows:

Mr. McGowan - present	Mr. Quaine - absent

The clerk read the minutes of the special meeting held December 21, 1970. Mr. Wright moved to accept the minutes as read, Mr. Marcus seconded. Roll call 4 ayes, 0 nays.

Mr. Wright read the Ordinance Calling For a Regular Election of Officers of the Village of Sleepy Hollow on Tuesday, April 20, 1971. Mr. Marcus moved to accept the afore-mentioned ordinance as read, Mr. Vesely seconded. Roll call was taken and answered as follows: 4 ayes, 0 nays.

Discussion by the trustees ensued on the numbering of houses in the village. Mr. Hofert said he would be willing to work on an ordinance requiring address numbers on every lot so that everyone would have a number in case of a fire or police call. Mr. Marcus will work with the post office to secure numbers. Mr. McGowan mentioned that the post office had been in contact with him relative to homeowners putting garbage cans in front of the mail boxes, requesting that they not do so as the mail cannot be delivered.

The clerk read the Municipal Retailers' Occupation Tax Ordinance. After the reading, Mr. Vesely moved to accept the afore-mentioned ordinance as read, Mr. Wright seconded. Roll call 4 ayes, 0 nays.

Mr. McGowan read a letter from Chief of Police Klinkhamer, of Carpentersville in regard to a survey by the International Assoc.

Of Chief's of Police with Carpentersville, which would include Sleepy Hollow. Board approval was given.

Mr. Vesely brought up for discussion the request from the Commonwealth Edison Company to install 5 ~~iron~~^{electric} poles on Winmoor Drive near the new school. Mr. Wright questioned Mr. Hofert on whether or not a law could be passed requiring underground wiring. Mr. Hofert replied that in his opinion the board could not regulate for appearances only but could regulate for public health and safety. Mr. Vesely said he would pursue the matter with the electric company and request that they go underground.

Mr. Vesely brought up for discussion the problem of a plumbing firm cutting across a road without first receiving permission. Mr. Hofert suggested that an estimate of the cost of repairing be made, and deposit that amount with the Village Treasurer, giving him a receipt, and when completed, the Treasurer will return the money.

Discussion was held on the repairing of Plum Court and Front Range Road by the developer. Mr. Hofert suggested a letter be sent to the developer for his signature, specifying how it should be completed. Mr. Wright will follow through on this.

Preliminary census - Mr. Sabatino said he thought that the preliminary census could be wrong from the number of vehicle stickers which will be sold. He suggested, however, that we wait until most of the stickers are purchased before we proceed.

Mr. Marcus moved to adjourn, Mr. Vesely seconded. Roll call: 4 ayes, 0 nays. Meeting adjourned 9:30 P.M.
