The new credit card payment system for tow and other fees will be demonstrated for the Village in January. Part-time officer candidates are being interviewed. A \$5,000+ grant was awarded to the village to replace the breathalyzer machine. In November, there were 9 vehicle accidents in the village, 5 which were on Randall Road. There were 7 administrative tow hearings today which were found liable for the fee. There are still cars sitting on the tow lot property from prior incidents.
